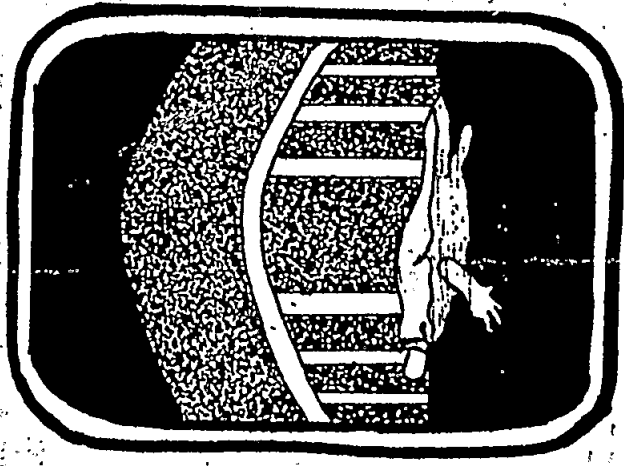


World Masters Swim '88 Brisbane 9th to 16th October, 1988

She also swam competitively for Tasmania being a member of Sandy Bay Swimming Club and has recently joined Hobart Aussi.

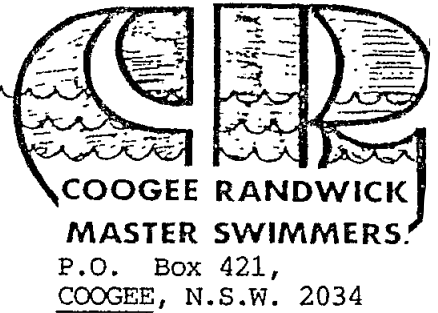
Ros has a wonderful personality and will be a great asset to our club. She is married with 2 children Kate 6 and Michael 2, she also has, I understand, other children under her care.

1987 COOGEE-RANDWICK "MINI MARATHON"
CHAMPIONSHIP SWIM (POSTAL)

SANCTIONED BY THE A.U.S.S.I. NATIONAL COUNCIL

Sponsored by: Coogee-Randwick Master Swimmers

Location and Time: To be swum in any pool 25 metres or longer and anytime during December 1987.

Entries to be postmarked no later than 6th January, 1988

Eligibility: Any swimmer 20 years of age and over who is a registered member of a Masters Swimming Club.

Age Groups: 20-24, 25-29, 30-34, 35-39, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, 80-84, 85-89, 90 & over.

Event: The object of the contest is to determine who can swim the greatest distance in 1/2 hour. Each swimmer must provide his/her own person to count laps, record splits and time the event with a stop watch. Swimmer and verifier must sign the official Entry Form. All distances are to be rounded down to the nearest 5 metre increment.

Awards: An engraved medal and a pair of swimming goggles will be awarded to the first swimmer in each age group for both sexes. Printed "Mini Marathon" swim caps and certificates will go to all swimmers.

Results: A copy of the results will be sent to each Club together with prizes.

Fees: A\$5-00 per swimmer. Please make cheques payable to COOGEE-RANDWICK MASTER SWIMMERS in Australian Dollars and cross Not Negotiable.

Oceania Masters One Hour Swim Championship Summer 1988

(POSTAL)



LOCATION AND TIME

To be swum in any pool 25 yards or longer and anytime in December 1987 and January 1988. Results must be converted to metres. Entries to be postmarked no later than 8th February, 1988.

ELIGIBILITY

Any swimmer 20 years of age and over who is also a registered Master Swimmer.

AGE GROUPS 20-24, (N.Z. Premasters), 25-29, 30-34, 35-39, 40-44, 45-49, 50-54, 55-59, 60-64, 65-69, 70-74, 75-79, 80 & over.

EVENT

The object of the event is to determine who can swim the greatest distance in one hour. Contestants are to provide their own official to count laps, take split times and time the event. Split times for every second length of the pool must be recorded and this record should be retained as proof of the distance swum in the event of any dispute. A club official, normally the club secretary, is to check the distance swum from the split record and must verify the result by signing the entry form. All distances are to be rounded down to the nearest five metre increment. Clubs are encouraged to stage the event as a club fixture and to send in bulk results with a single cheque or bank draft.

AWARDS

Arena Products will be awarded to the swimmers in each age group (1 male, 1 female) who swims the greatest distance.

RESULTS

Full results will be published in Aussi and N.Z. Masters National Newsletters.
