## PRESIDENT'S REPORT – SEPTEMBER 1995

Our major event this year was hosting the Summer Championships at Glenorchy in February 1995 where AUSSI members officiated. This was a most successful swim meet, with a record number of 144 entries.

We trialed a new computer programme; semi automatic timing (SAT); and sheets for events, replacing individual cards. These changes to our AUSSI swim meets all went without a hitch, so much so, they will be used for all our Branch Championships. Talays can be very proud of this achievement. Comment was made from another club, "it is indeed a feather in Talays rather large and growing hat".

Congratulations, and thanks, to Meet Director Pauline Samson who put in endless hours of work. Also thanks to committee members, family and friends, who gave their weekend, ensuring all tasks were taken care of, enabling the event to run smoothly. Saturday night's happy hour plus the Presentation lunch were both well patronized and enjoyed by all.

As usual Talays were represented at courses and seminars: Time Keepers Course - five (5) Coaching Seminar: - three (3). Congratulations to these members.

We hosted the 800m freestyle for the Winter Titles, half hour and three quarter hour swims as Glenorchy. Representation came from Talays at the Dover Seafest, Trevallyn Open Water Swim and Carlton Long Distance Swim.

Ten (10) members will enjoy the challenge, competition and friendship at the VicHealth 5th Australian Masters Games in October.

Talays still remains the largest club in the State and although we are not highly competitive, it was very pleasing to have a record number competing in both Summer & Winter Titles. Those who choose to compete always have a great time, both in the pool and at social functions. Our times go down; our P.B's bettered; more medals are brought home; along with National and Branch records. July saw us holding our first club swim, giving our members new and old the chance to swim at competition level in a more relaxed atmosphere. There will be more of these in the future. Two video nights gave members the opportunity to be filmed, see the replay, and discuss the GOOD or BAD news with the coach. Thanks to Robert Bonney for setting up the equipment for those nights.





## TREASURERS REPORT

Year Ended 31 August 1995

Annual financial statements are presented to the meeting.

A profit of **\$1580.34** was made during the financial year. This compares with **\$756.55** the previous year. This includes profits from the Summer Championships.

The main sources of income this year were :-

- 1) Registration Fees - **\$6,112.00**
- 2) Pool Hire Fees - **\$9,337.00**

The main expenses were :-

- 1) Pool Hire - **\$10,000.00**
- 2) Coaching - **\$2,670.00**
- 3) Aussi Masters Subscriptions - **\$2,698.00**

The club ended the year with a bank balance of **\$ 4,634.59**, which reflects credit on all committee members, past and present, involved with the finances of the club.
