Without doubt, the biggest issue we have managed this year has been the lobbying for the development of the Regional Aquatic Centre and the subsequent challenges to maintain our swimming program that success has brought on us. The fact that we have managed this successfully is of great credit to the committee and Ray Brien in particular. The fact that other clubs are struggling to find lane space when we are well established indicates the level of professionalism with which we tackled the problem.

We have a growing membership, a fact that has at times concerned me when I felt that we could possibly be compromising safety and the quality of existing member's swimming. However we now have more training times and more venues, including open water swims, than we have ever had and we seem to be managing the situation but we will monitor the numbers closely.

We have also of course continued our great performances in the pool and open water at AUSSI state and national meets and individually at other competitions such as Masters and triathlons. We have celebrated these during the year.

We have partied hard and often. There is a new proverb out there, "Whenever five or more AUSSI members are gathered, there will be a social event". Our breakfasts emphasise the important role the social side of the club plays in life of the members.

We have been innovative, introducing variety in training sessions, stroke correction and open water swims so that we not only provide just pool space but assist people to meet their training needs and develop their swimming.

We are financially sound and well managed and offer extremely good "value for money" for subscription and pool fees.

With the makeover of our outfits we will look good as well as feel good and we have attracted sponsorship to assist us with that.

We communicate well with our members; we have embraced the use of email and the web to keep our members informed and in touch with what's happening. Streamline rivals the popular glossies such as New Idea and National Geographic and our meeting minutes are professional.

None of this happens by itself, it's PEOPLE who make it happen and our only remunerated position is our stroke correction coach Jake. We need to remind ourselves occasionally that we are a group of volunteers trying to do the best for the club and its members and occasionally we might get a few things a bit wrong, so bear that in mind and don't complain but get in and suggest how something can be done better and share the load.

Coaching Coordinator

I wish to thank the club for accepting my role as the coaching coordinator for the last year. It has been a challenging and interesting period of time. I would also like to acknowledge the assistance of Jake for coaching and providing stroke correction sessions, Tim for providing programs on Wednesday mornings and also Jenny for her organization on Time Trial nights and Kay for organising the Aerobic sessions.

The closure of Windmill Hill, whilst welcomed in the long term, provided some headaches and lateral thinking to continue with a reasonable program over the Christmas/New Year period. My thanks to all club members for their ready acceptance of the final outcome and short notice changes to the program. Open water swims have gained a loyal following over the seven swims so far – with some courageous efforts from the less strong swimmers in difficult conditions. The use of a GPS to set out the course provided a measure of consistency in course length.

For most of the year we continued with 5 sessions per week, but recently this has expanded to 8 sessions with the inclusion of sessions run jointly with the Launceston Triathlon Club. I now feel that the majority of Club members can now access sessions to suit their ability and/or expectations. The Grammar pool has proved popular and an acceptable alternative swimming venue. We are slowly accepting the different conditions – water temperature and lane width being the main issues.

From the 1st of March 2008 there will be a ‘responsible person’ for each session and their name will appear on the swim program. This person will be responsible for the general conduct of the session and resolve any issues arising during the session.

Again, thank you to all the Club members for their acceptance of my efforts throughout the year.

TREASURER'S REPORT 2007

The club operated at a small loss of \$382 compared to a surplus of \$1645 in 2006.

Our main income comes from pool fees and member subscriptions which increased by almost \$2500 over the previous year to total over \$20,000. Part of the increase is from the \$10 increase in subscription fee, and partly because of the added swim sessions each week. Our income from events was lower as we did not host the 2007 Summer Championships, and sales of club clothing were lower than the previous year. We received sponsorship of \$500 from Cube which has been used to subsidise a free club cap for all 2008 current members

Expenses increased by less than \$1000, and included:

Club swimming costs increased by \$2500, including pool hire, up \$700 – mainly additional sessions at AMC, (and lower costs after Windmill Hill closed); AUSSI registration, up \$650, and coaching fees \$630.

The club subsidised social events to the tune of \$900, this included the Christmas breakfast at Cube as well as the winter dinner, Christmas party and lunch after the Open Water Championship at Beauty Point.

Administration expenses decreased overall, main savings arose from email distribution of newsletters.

The Club is in a strong financial position with \$11,000 held in a term deposit with Bendigo Bank.

I would like to thank Chris Moore, Hector and Ray for assisting with money collection and banking. It is amazing how difficult it is to balance the pool fees – almost always more or less money than people signed in!

1 Accounting Policies

These financial statements are a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the accounts preparation requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Tasmania) 1964.

The committee have determined that the AUSSI Masters Swimming in Australia Launceston Incorporated is not a reporting entity and therefore there is no need to apply Australian Accounting Standards or other mandatory professional reporting requirements in the preparation and presentation of the financial statements.

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with previous periods unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report:







INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the members of AUSSI Masters Swimming in Australia Launceston Incorporated

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of AUSSI Masters Swimming in Australia Launceston Incorporated, which comprises the balance sheet as at 31 December 2007, the income statement for the year then ended, a summary of significant accounting policies, other explanatory notes and the treasurer's declaration.

The Responsibility of the Committee for the Financial Report

The committee of the association is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report and have determined that the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements which form part of the financial report are appropriate to meet the financial reporting requirements of the constitution and are appropriate to meet the needs of the members.

The committee's responsibility also includes establishing and maintaining internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; selecting and applying appropriate accounting policies; and making accounting estimates that are reasonable in the circumstances.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the financial report based on our audit. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used, as described in Note 1, are appropriate to meet the needs of the members. We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. These Auditing Standards require that we comply with relevant ethical requirements relating to audit engagements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the financial report is free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial report. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial report, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the committee, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial report.

The financial report has been prepared for distribution to members for the purpose of fulfilling the committee's financial reporting under the constitution. We disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates to any person other than the members, or for any purpose other than that for which it was prepared. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Independence

In conducting our audit, we have complied with the independence requirements of the Australian professional accounting bodies and the Associations Incorporation Act (Tas) 1964.

Basis for Qualified Auditor's Opinion

Pool fees are a significant source of revenue for AUSSI Masters Swimming in Australia Launceston Incorporated. The committee has determined that it is impracticable to establish control over the collection of this revenue prior to entry into its financial records. Accordingly, as the evidence available to us regarding revenue from this source was limited, our audit procedures with respect to pool fees was restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records. We therefore are unable to express an opinion as to the completeness of the association's revenue.

Qualified Auditor's Opinion

In our opinion, except for except for the effects of such adjustments, if any, as might have been determined to be necessary had we been able to satisfy ourselves as to the completeness of revenue:

- the financial report presents fairly, in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements, the financial position of AUSSI Masters Swimming in Australia Launceston Incorporated at 31 December 2007, and of its performance for the year then ended;
- we obtained the information we required for the audit and AUSSI Masters Swimming in Australia Launceston Incorporated kept proper accounting records and other books during the year ended 31 December 2007; and
- the rules relating to the administration of the funds of AUSSI Masters Swimming in Australia Launceston Incorporated have been observed.

ANNUAL MEETING 21ST FEBRUARY 2008

This last year we achieved some milestones with our various swim times and competitions.

The Club participated in the Summer Championships in Devonport and the Winters in Hobart with the Club achieving wins in both competitions. 
